He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.


THE COMMUNION RITE

If you are not Catholic or are not disposed to receive the Sacrament today, you are still more than welcome to come forward: simply cross your arms with your hands on the opposite shoulder to signal to the minister that you will receive a blessing. – Fr. MacNeill
